

Town meeting with Sheriff Jenkins  
**2008 Annual LLA Meeting**

This year's Lake Linganore Association (LLA) annual meeting on Saturday, May 17, features the election of the board of directors and a town meeting with the Frederick County Sheriff. The meeting, which will be held at Deer Crossing Elementary School, starts at 10 a.m., the election starts at 10:05 a.m. and at noon residents get a chance to talk to Sheriff Chuck Jenkins.

This year's election will be the first competitive one in several years. There are five directorships available and eight members have submitted their names as candidates. Two incumbents—Robert Charles (Pinehurst) and Stephen Hembree (Nightingale)—have put their names on the ballot. Two candidates have previously served on the board—Jim Cates (Summerfield) and Alan Dinkelacker (Aspen)— and three others are first-time candidates—Katherine Hembree (Nightingale), Steve Ekanger (Westwinds) and James Arieno (Coldstream). The League of Women Voters (LWV) of Montgomery County will again be election day judges and will handle all proxy votes. The LWV has been working with the LLA on its board elections since 1995 as a way to ensure the integrity of the election process. LLA Election Committee members working with the LWV are: Mary Roland, Judy Snow, Mikki McElheny, David O'Berry, Ed Black, Pat Veon, David Swanson, Naura Swanson, Karen Frazier.

Because the LLA is incorporated, its board election is conducted as a corporate election. Corporate rules allow members or stockholders (property owners) in the corporation to vote by proxy if they cannot attend the annual meeting to vote in person. Outgoing LLA board president Brandon Frazier will present a "state of the association" report. Land Stewards developer John Clarke will present a "state of the project" report to the community and county project manager Terry Irwin will report on the status of the county's water and sewer project in the villages of Balmoral and Meadows. Larry Dusold, president of the Lake Linganore Conservation Society (LLCS), will report on the LLA roads and storm water management project in Coldstream/Balmoral/Meadows.

Frederick County Sheriff Chuck Jenkins has been visiting county towns this year to meet with residents about their concerns. "The sheriff will begin his meeting at noon and will be available until 1:30

p.m. if the audience requires it," noted LLA general manager Clay Edwards. Light refreshments will be served for those attending the sheriff's town meeting.
