Workshop Overview (Event was held on April 17, 2014)

Crime Details Discussed

- Theft within Lake Linganore has decreased 14% since 2012-2013
- Midday Burglaries are most common (between the hours of 9am-3pm)
- Create a deterrent by leaving lights on and prevent theft by always locking vehicles and homes
- No matter how minor the incident—ALWAYS make a police report

Getting Involved in Neighborhood Watch

- Communication is Critical—the Program relies entirely on citizen involvement
- Informational emails are communicated by FCSO county wide
- If you see something, always call—be descriptive
- Neighborhood Watch Coordinators help communicate information to the community

- Contractors operating without an MHIC # are not a legal business
- Your yard is private property and you can ask them to leave
